"She did," Cordsmeyer said. but we are branching off to do bigger and better things."


> James and Cordsmeyer felt that while the class was branching and growing they were also growing closer. Thierry highlighted some of those experiences.

Malerie Meier said, the class of 2018 is special because everyone is involved and active within the school.




Molly Hutson said, "I think that the characteristic that sets my class apart from others is the friendship we all share. Everyone in my class tries to spend time



What is something you always want to remember about your senior year?


